The first cleaning party of the 2017 season will be held on Saturday, May 13th, weather permitting. Members will receive an email when Sharon returns from vacation. After a cold wet winter, it's time to start thinking about summer projects at our local cemeteries. May was cool and damp, so we'll try and start our cleaning bees in mid-June. There are a number of things to check out before getting started, so there are no firm dates yet. The membership will be informed of dates by email. Our goal for restoration this year is to raise, repair and clean six monuments that have been down for years and to add five more row markers. There are also a few monuments that were broken over the winter, probably by the deer, and we will try and fix them as well. This type of restoration is labour intensive, requiring lifting, digging, and sometimes concrete work. We're looking for some younger volunteers to help with these projects and learn the techniques used in monument restoration. Dr. Sven Jensen was a prominent physician and psychiatrist in Victoria and he was very involved in Rotary for many years. He was the President of the British Columbia Psychiatric Association, Island Chapter, and he was highly respected and admired for his many years of service. He was also a member of the American Psychiatric Association and attended many of the APA conventions in North America. After retirement he remained

involved with Rotary and he became very active in the Old Cemeteries Society. He was a most reliable and affable individual but ill health robbed him of his abilities in recent years. Sven was a devout Christian. He died on April 5th and was interred in Royal Oak Burial Park.

Jim's Mother lives in Pasadena, California and her mother, Jim's maternal grandmother, had a very active relationship and correspondence with Sister Loyola, Sisters of St. Ann in Victoria, before she died. Jim visited the Nellie Cashman gravesite, and a short time later Tony Cerciello arranged for a film to be produced involving Jim O'Fallon and authoress Thora Kerr Illing, who wrote "The Gold Rush Queen".
